From 4th to 7th November 2024, Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) will proudly host its 28th Convocation Ceremony, where 3,932 students will receive their degrees from the newly appointed Chancellor, Tuan Yang Terutama Yang di-Pertua Negeri Sarawak, Tun Pehin Sri Dr. Wan Junaidi Tuanku Jaafar.

There will be seven sessions all together where on the first session, 612 postgraduates are expected to receive their scrolls on the first day of convocation. On the second day, students from three faculties, namely the Faculty of Cognitive Sciences and Human Development (485), the Faculty of Build Environment (67), and the Faculty of Social Science and Humanities (521) receive their degrees.



Cross-Border Initiative Boosts Women's Health in Mukah

A collaborative effort between UNIMAS and Indonesia's Institut Teknologi Kesehatan (ITEKES) Muhammadiyah has brought a significant women's health initiative to Mukah, Sarawak. The program, led by a nine-person delegation from ITEKES headed by Rector Bapak Haryanto, focused on raising awareness and preventing cervical cancer.

Titled "From the University to the Community: A Women's Health Awareness," the initiative aimed to directly engage the community, leveraging academic and medical expertise. Professor Dr. Asri Said, Dean of FMHS, highlighted the urgency, noting that Sarawak has the highest incidence of cervical cancer in Malaysia, with 12.1 cases per 100,000 population.

The event featured cervical cancer screenings using the advanced HPV DNA-based test, recommended by the WHO for its effectiveness over traditional Pap smears. The screenings were part of the SUARA program, funded by the Premier's Office and the Ministry of Finance, Malaysia.

Breast cancer screenings were also conducted, supported by the Sarawak Breast Cancer Support Group. The initiative included various activities for youth, such as mental health talks and cultural exchanges, aiming to foster a broader appreciation of Southeast Asian diversity.

The program's success was attributed to the collaboration of multiple stakeholders, emphasizing the importance of continued community-focused efforts for a healthier society.

In a groundbreaking move towards sustainable agriculture, a student-team named THE CATALYST from the Faculty of Resource Science and Technology at Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) is leading a research on using banana waste to cultivate oyster mushrooms.

Supported by the UNIMAS Entrepreneurship Centre (UEC) and guided by Dr. Mohamad Hasnul bin Bolhassan and Dr. Ainaa Nadiah binti Abd Halim, this innovative project aims to convert agricultural waste into a valuable resource for mushroom farming.

Preliminary results indicate that banana waste, particularly the pseudo-stem and leaves, is rich in nutrients and could serve as a cost-effective and sustainable substrate for mushroom cultivation. This approach not only addresses waste management but also provides a practical solution for commercial-scale production of *Pleurotus ostreatus*, commonly known as oyster mushrooms.

The team's dedication to innovation and sustainability is paving the way for new agricultural practices that benefit both the environment and the economy. By optimizing the substrate formulation, they hope to enhance the nutritional needs of the mushrooms, making this method a viable option for large-scale cultivation.
